



Summer Employment: Parks and Recreation

The Nevada Parks and Recreation Department is accepting applications for a variety of seasonal employment opportunities for the upcoming spring and summer.

Aquatic Center - Positions available include Manager, Assistant Manager, Head Guards, Lifeguards and Swim Lesson Instructors. If you are at least 15 years old by mid-May and are interested, consider taking the Lifeguard Training Class. Those with previous experience in aquatics will be considered for additional job responsibilities, including being part of the Management Team. Contact Nevada Parks and Recreation for training information. We will train the right candidate for any position.

Concession/Cashiers - Positions will work at both Fawcett Family Aquatic Center and the SCORE 4-Plex. Must be at least 14 years old by March 31.

Umpires - Youth baseball and softball umpires. Weekday evenings April – Early July.

Athletic Field/Sports Complex Staff - Baseball/softball field prep and complex maintenance. Work hours are evenings & weekends from April – July. Must be at least 16 years old.

Parks/Cemetery Maintenance - General grounds and building maintenance throughout the city. Must be at least 17 years old. Monday – Friday, 7:30 a.m. – 4:00 p.m., and weekends as scheduled. Staff will be required to assist in weekend tournaments. There are positions available for the months of April – November and positions available for the months of May – August.

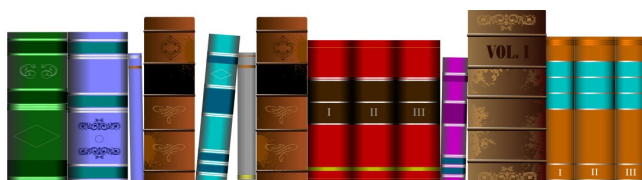
