Cemetery Spring Clean Up

During this time, all decorations will be disposed of, including those that are placed in vases, saddles, or on Shepherd's hooks if they are damaged or unsightly. Any decorations that you wish to keep must be removed prior to this time and new decorations may be placed back out after the clean-up. Nuisance Abatements

A nuisance may consist of any or all of the following: refuse, garbage, rubbish, ashes, scrap lumber, building materials, abandoned or unattended refrigerators, inoperative appliances, other substances offensive to sight, smell, or detrimental to the health, welfare and best interests of community.

If you want to report any properties you believe are in violation please contact the Nevada Public Safety Department at 515-382-4305. If you wish to know more about this topic, check the City of Nevada web site under Code of Ordinances. Please clean up your yard and avoid any legal issues which will be time consuming and expensive.

Cemetery - New Lots Available in April

The Nevada Municipal Cemetery has finished marking out new lots on the east side of the cemetery. These new lots are located adjacent to the cemetery entrance along First Street. Cemetery staff will begin selling spaces to the public beginning April 2, 2018. Prices for these spaces remain the same as other standard burial spaces in the cemetery. Pets in the Parks/Cemetery

With spring and nice weather fast approaching, the Parks and Recreation Department would like to remind everyone of a few simple courtesies when visiting the parks and cemetery. Everyone likes to have a positive experience and enjoy a clean environment. Please be sure to pick up after your pet when you have them out with you. There are pet waste stations placed at most entrances to the trail system. If you don't bring a bag with you, please pick one up before entering the park.

Pets must be on a leash at all times. This is a safety issue for all park users, as well as for your pet. Failure to keep your pet on a leash may result in a citation as outlined in the City of Nevada Municipal Code of Ordinances.

Pets are not allowed on any athletic field at any time. The Parks staff works very hard to

provide quality athletic fields for all our community sporting events. The kids, coaches, and spectators involved in these activities deserve a clean and sanitary venue for their activity.

Lastly, dogs are allowed in the cemetery, but must be on a leash and remain on the roadways at all times. At no time shall anyone allow their dog to run at large in the cemetery. There is no pet waste station at the cemetery, please remember to bring a bag with you and pick up after your pet.
